competence training curriculum developed by a 30-member committee convened by the Illinois Department

of Public Health.

The goal of the training is to provide health care providers with the necessary knowledge and skills to deliver culturally competent care and services to diverse populations.

The Opening Doors curriculum does not focus on any particular ethnic group as this could encourage stereotypical beliefs.
